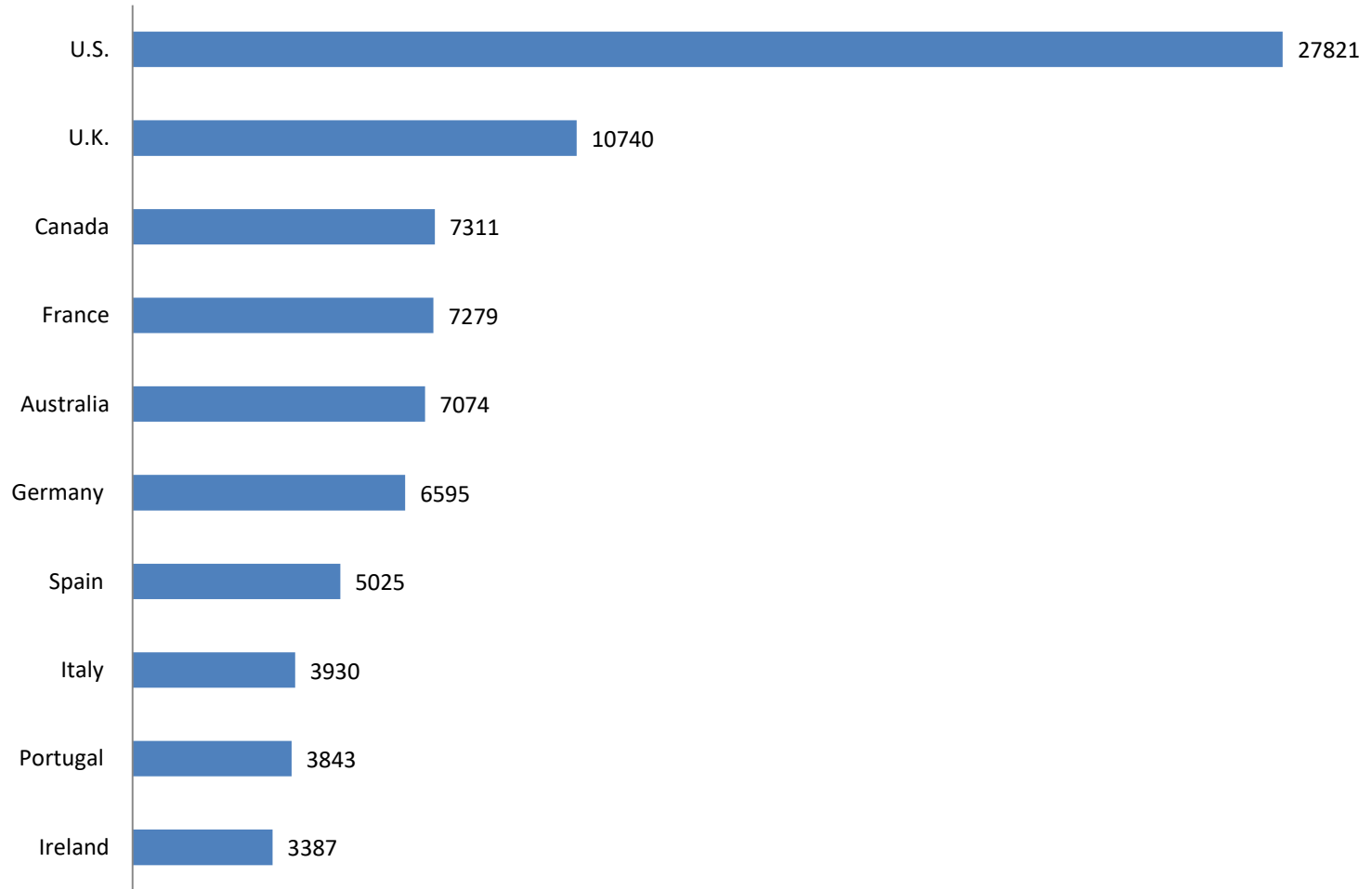

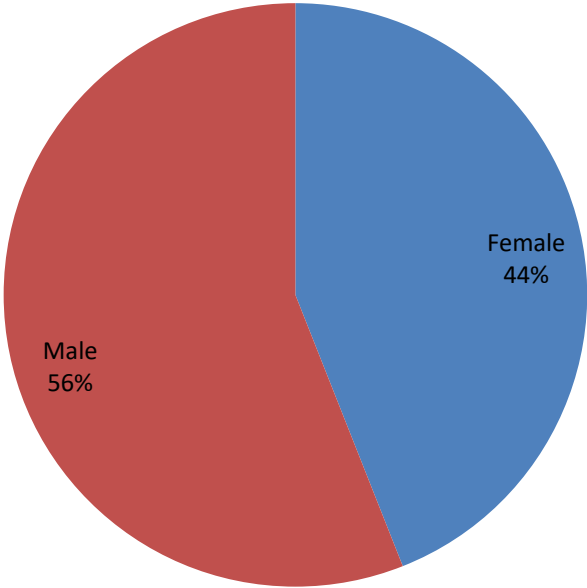
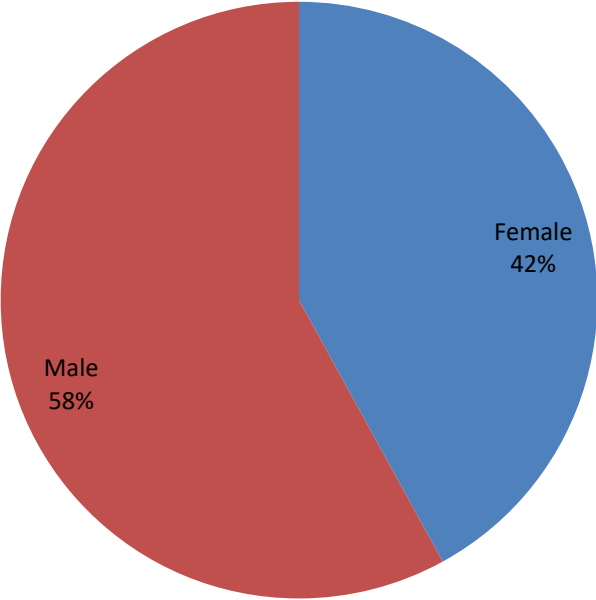
Brazil's Science without Borders Programme: Brief Overview

- Established by the Brazilian government (MSTI) and funded between 2011-2015
- Managed in Brazil by CAPES and CNPQ
- Principal aims to:
 - Enhance Brazil's capacity in science and technology by promoting study abroad opportunities for Brazilians at the world's leading educational institutions
- Over 100,000 Brazilian students have participated
- Annual cost of programme=R\$B3.7B
- Canada is programme's third largest recipient (>7300 students)
- Total "export" value to Canada= >\$280M
- Principal interlocutors in Canada
 - Canadian Bureau of International Education
 - CALDO
 - Colleges and Institutes Canada

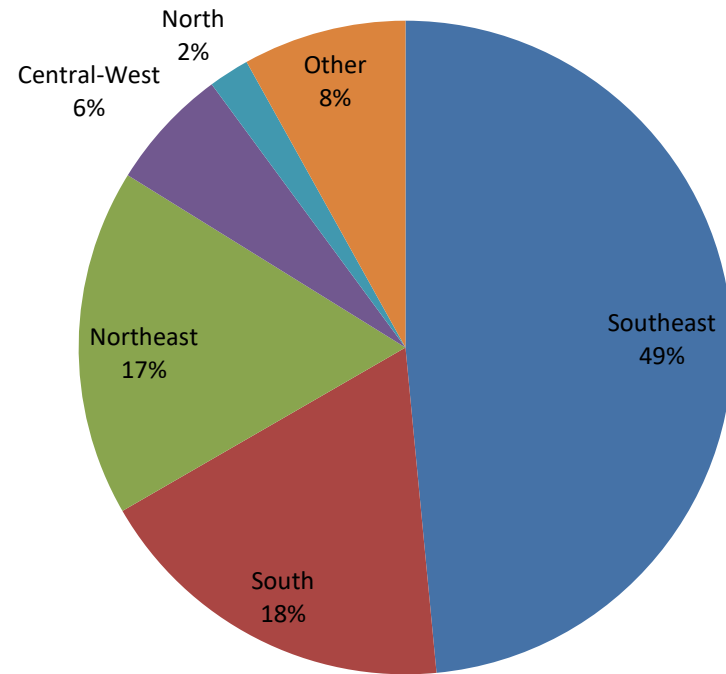
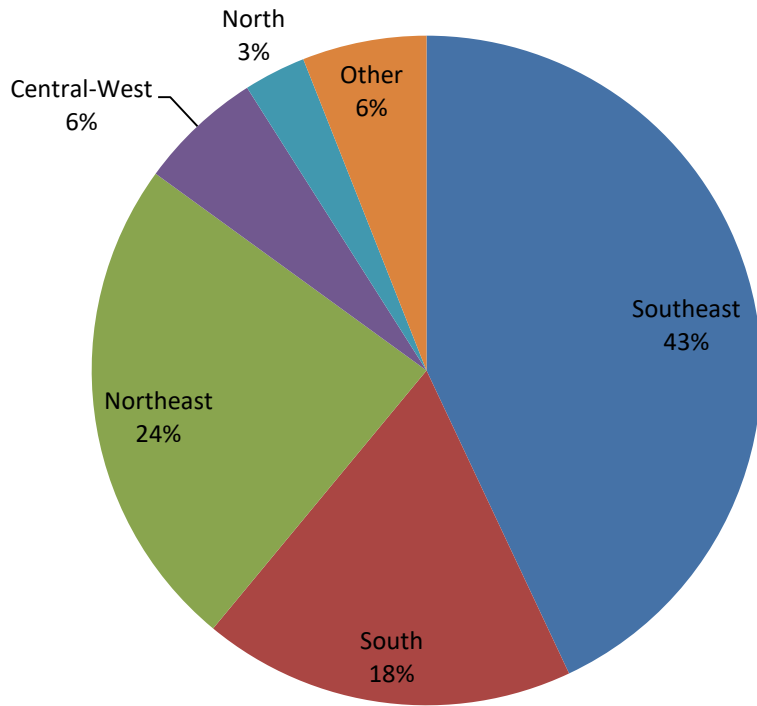
Outbound SwB Students—Top Ten Countries



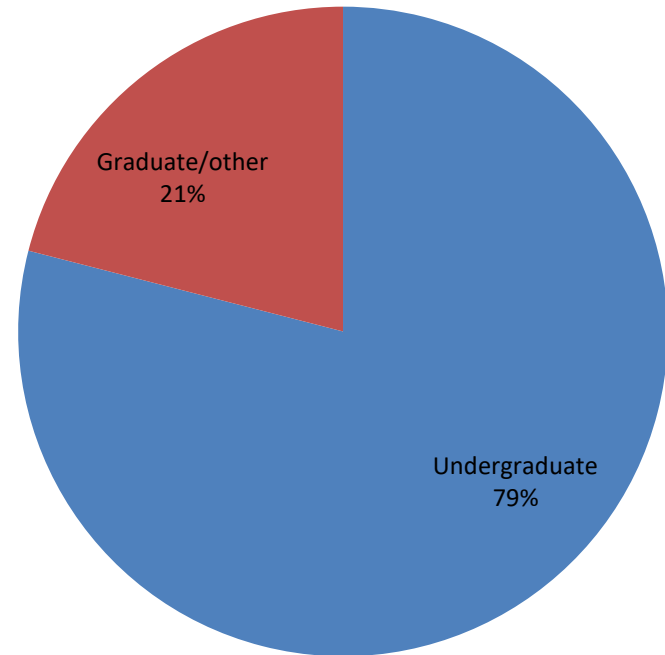
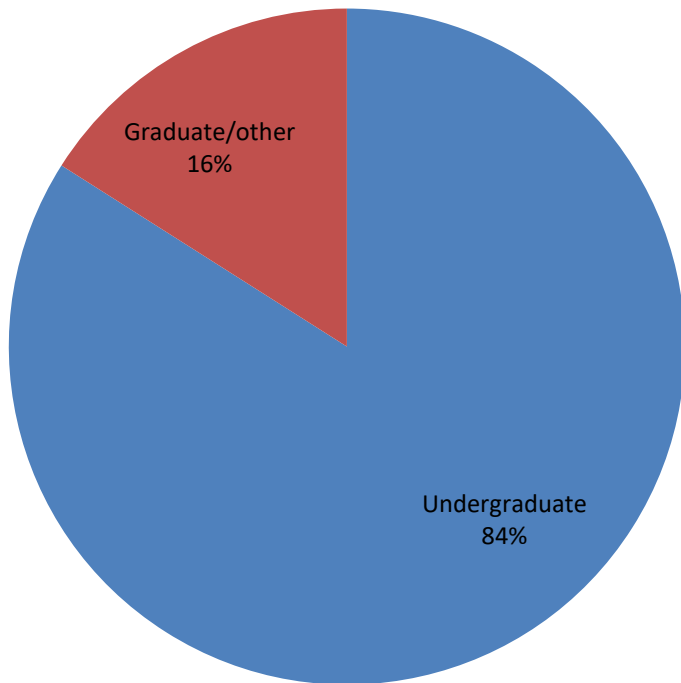
Gender of Canada-Bound vs. Total SwB Students



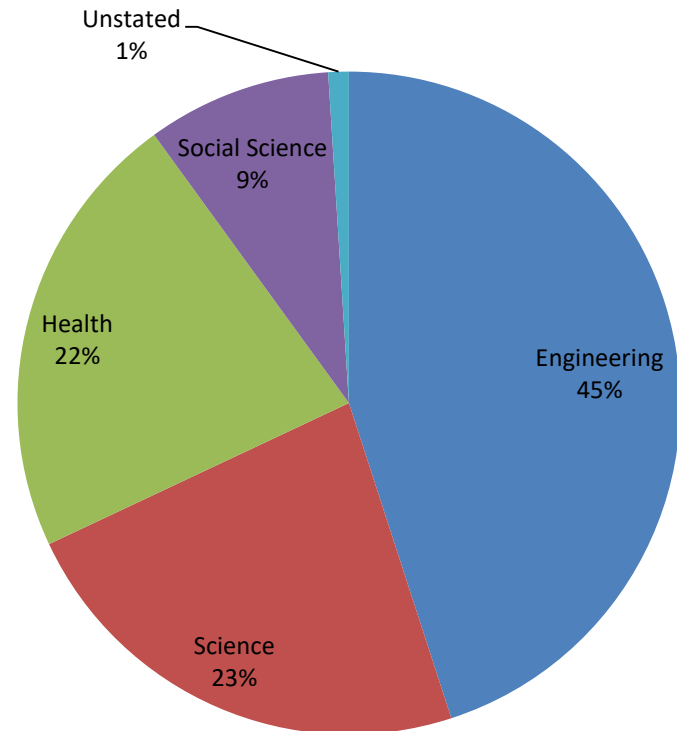
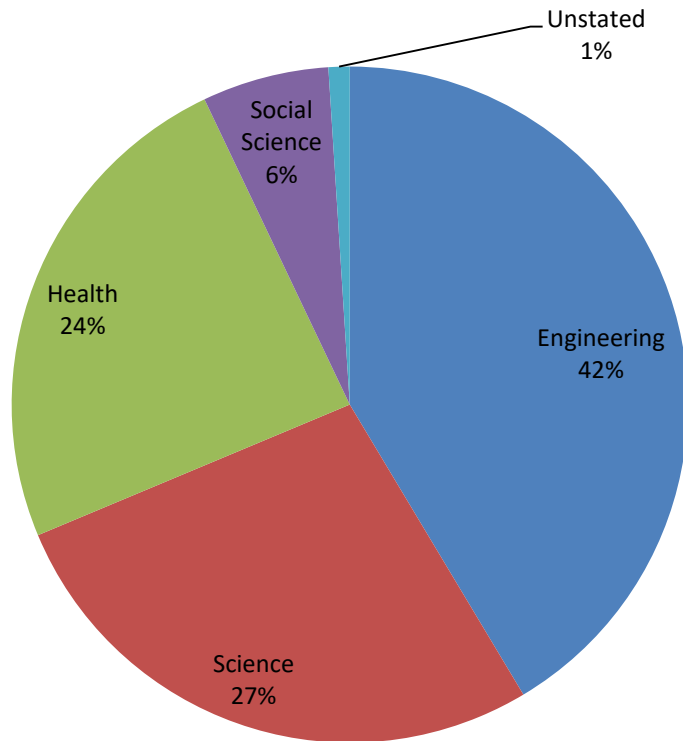
Regional Origin

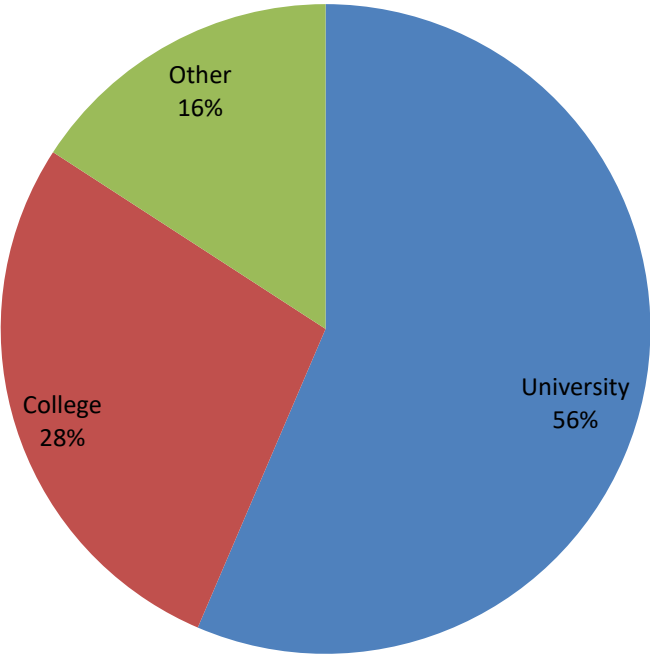

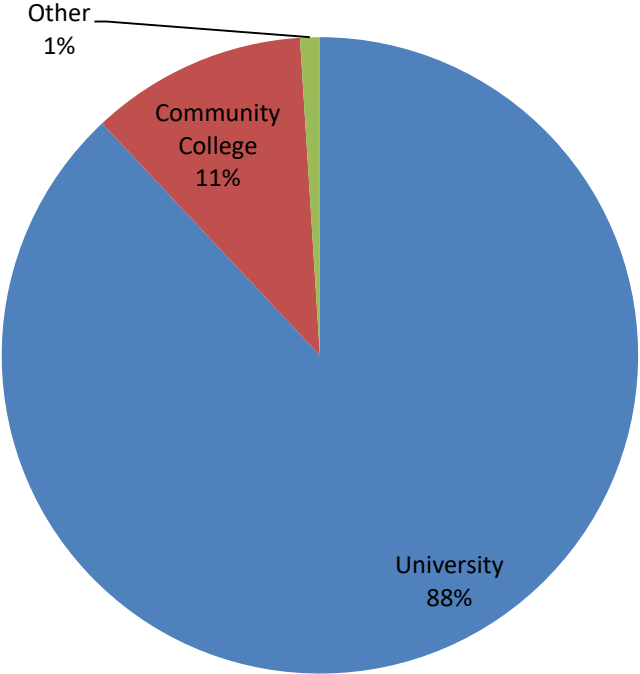


Place of Study—Canada-Bound SwB Students
